In-school barriers <i>(issues to be addressed in school)</i>	
A.	Phonics – KS1 – many children are not at the reading level for their age due to disruptions to their learning over a prolonged period. The ability to decode, read fluently and comprehend text is key for their transition into KS2 and in order for them to access all areas of the curriculum.
B.	Year 6 catch up teaching required - children are further behind in English and Maths than anticipated and need significant work to narrow the gaps in order to make them secondary school ready.
